

# A Season of Hope and Homecoming


Recognizing a 45% increase in adoptions

### A Tale of Three Tails: When Amanda Met Aegon

#### Volunteer, Adopter, Superstar

It all started when Amanda Rawson came to adopt her dog, KC from the shelter in April 2022. Amanda quickly realized KC needed a playmate, and so she returned to the shelter in August to adopt Sky. After a few months, she realized she wanted to do more for all the animals she couldn't adopt, so Amanda and her mom began volunteering as dog walkers.

For the past three years, Amanda has been walking dogs, helping at events, and serving as our resident photographer. After getting her first camera in high school, Amanda fell in love with photography. At the shelter, Amanda shoots intake photos of our animals and some of our events. Her goal is to capture joyful moments at our events that help our new arrivals look their best for adoption profiles. As a side gig, she photographs senior portraits and family photos.

Our long-term residents have a special place in Amanda's heart. She remarked how, "They get so excited to see you! It's the best part of their day. You can tell they truly appreciate the time you give to them." Eventually, Amanda started to fall for long-term resident, Aegon. She wanted to make sure he would be a good fit for her home.
